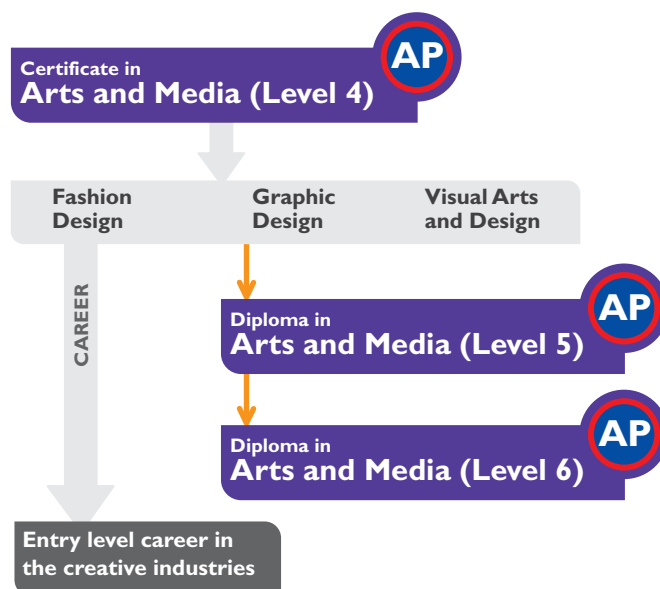

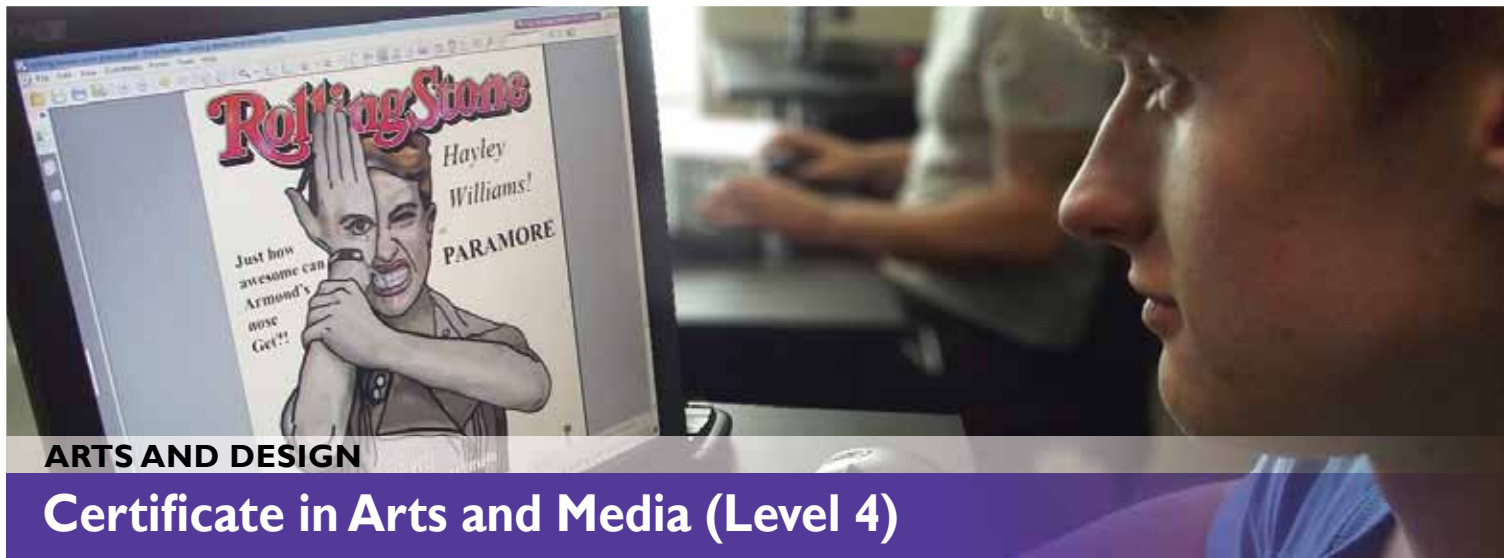

What will this programme cover?

This programme covers a range of Art and Media subjects, giving you a broad range of skills and prepares you for further specialist study.

Fashion Design

- **Fashion Design:** Learn how to turn design ideas into creative forms within the context of fashion Design.
- **Textiles:** Learn to use and experiment with a variety of textiles, machinery and equipment to create and embellish your own product and garment.
- **Pattern Work:** Use pattern making tools to learn about the relationship between lines and curves to create your own patterns.
- **Visual Culture:** Gain a theoretical understanding of the relationship between fashion and art.

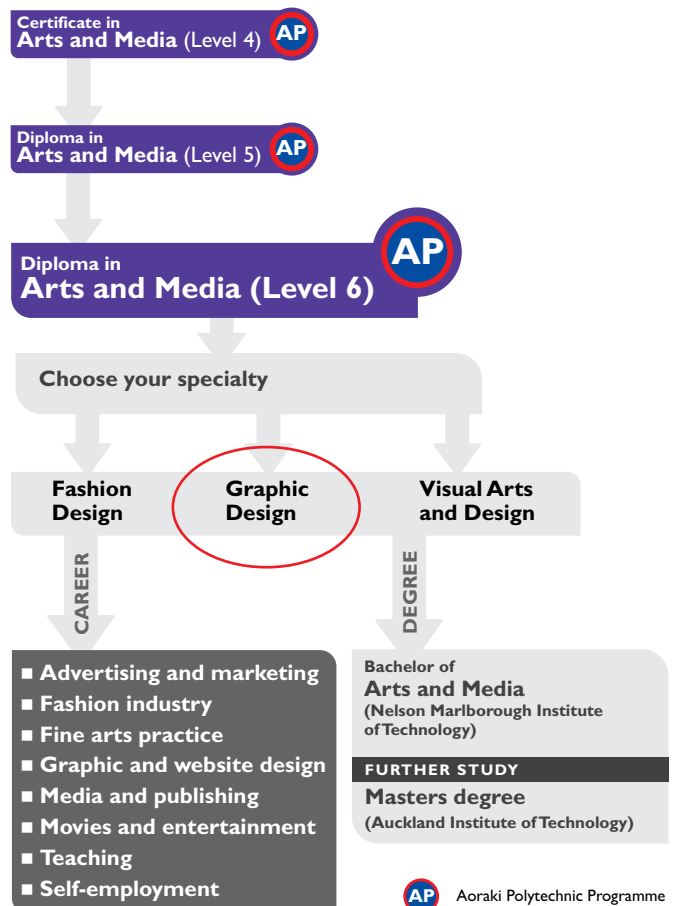

The Level 5 Diploma continues the work begun on the Certificate in Arts and Media (Level 4) with a higher degree of specialisation in graphic design and multimedia. As well as studying logo design, visual identities, creating your own t-shirt range and picture book you will include the use of animation to create awesome motion graphics.

What will this programme cover?

- Design and produce digital images and design solutions.
- Digital media and equipment, including image input devices, image capture, image manipulation software, file management, output protocols.
- Graphic design principles and processes, including basic layout, colour theory, typography.
- Interpret and carry out graphic design projects in response to specified briefs.
- Source and apply design industry knowledge.
- Conceptual processes through visual and contextualising diaries.
- ½ elective and ½ core arts and design study.

- Application of marketing and consumer profiling techniques in developing designs to commercial standards.
- Demonstration of practical skills involving the production of multi-page documents, campaign driven brand development, 'live' industry briefs, corporate identity, illustration and logo development.
- Techniques for graphic design and illustrative work.
- Preparation of a personal graphic design portfolio for use in 'live' industry.
- ¾ elective and ¼ core arts and design study.

Gain a qualification to discover a career in fashion design, assistant design, costuming, patternmakers, production managers, stylists, merchandising, fashion buying and retail.

Graduates of the Diploma in Arts & Media (Fashion Design) design and create fashion collections while engage in experimentation, innovation and creativity, independent work habits, and the professional presentation of design solutions that mimic industry. This is completed in our spacious work rooms

As well as submitting a collection of garments to showcase to friends, family and key contacts in the industry for the annual Pose fashion show you will organise and coordinate the show with hair, beauty and photography students. Students also attend Hokonui Fashion awards and Style Pasifika Awards.

You will also complete work experiences with top designers and develop a portfolio of work that will assist you in gaining entry into degree level studies or employment. Our Arts and Design Diploma has a direct pathway onto NMIT's Arts and Design degree programme.

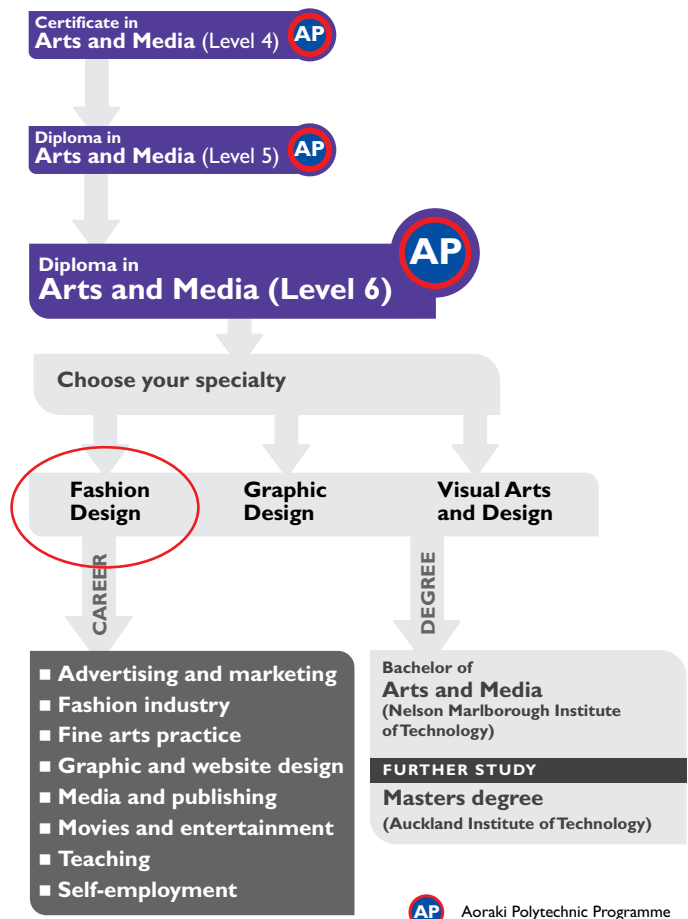

Strengthen and develop your skills from Level 4 with a level 5 Diploma in Arts and Media qualification endorsed in Fashion Design. You Investigative and experimental, involving textiles shapes and forms for design. Develop creative design concepts through observation and conceptual approaches.

Broaden and extend to more complex garment types that require greater attention to fit on the body through tailoring, couture techniques and bodywear. Computer aided patternmaking (PAD software) is introduced to advance patternmaking skills to those needed in industry. Business studies introduces business practice and prepares the students for employment applications.

Digital media is introduced to assist in the creation of collection designs and the professional presentation of student design work. You will also design and create garments for the annual Pose fashion show held at the end of the academic year.

- Production of garment patterns suitable for applying design elements.

- Technical skills for the construction of garments and other product lines.

Consolidate your skills and knowledge from year one and prepare for entry into the fashion industry. Greater emphasis is put on the manufacturing process and the marketplace. Continue research and extend conceptual and technical skills through projects.

Gain advanced knowledge on contemporary culture through the connection of Fashion Design. Organise and co-ordinate the annual Pose fashion show and design and create a collection to showcase at the event. You will also develop a portfolio and collection which will help with entry into the industry or pathway onto NMIT's Arts and Design degree programme.

- Production of garment pattern designs using both manual and electronic applications.
- Electronic applications following professional industry standards.
- Investigation and planning of a number of designs from conception through to completed garments.
- Application of appropriate technical skills to an advanced level using a wide variety of textiles.
- Investigation of a variety of apparel target markets to produce a relevant business plan.
- Application of management skills and quality standards to prescribed and self-directed activities.
- ½ elective and ½ core arts and design study.

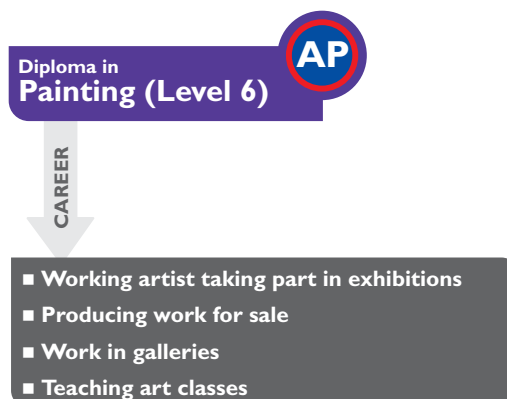
